Overview of the New Schools White Paper

The Government has introduced a new education plan called Every Child Achieving and Thriving, designed to raise standards for all children and reduce the gap between disadvantaged pupils and their peers. A key focus is improving support for children with special educational needs and disabilities (SEND). Every child with additional needs will eventually have a new Individual Support Plan - a digital record that parents and teachers can access and update together.

The curriculum will also be refreshed to make learning broader and more engaging, with stronger digital, financial and communication skills, alongside an enrichment entitlement offering wider opportunities in arts, sport, culture and outdoor learning. The white paper also recognises the importance of family support, with plans to expand Family Hubs, breakfast clubs, mental-health teams and youth services.

Major changes such as the new curriculum are planned from 2028, with updated GCSEs from 2029, as part of a 10-year programme requiring new laws. Trevelyan Middle School and our Trust will proactively plan for these changes and will keep parents informed as we know more.

I have thoroughly enjoyed my first week as Headteacher at Trevelyan Middle School. It has been a pleasure getting to know the school, and I am quickly getting up to speed with the many aspects of daily life here.
