SEND Parent Forum – Key Highlights

Thank you to all parents who attended our recent SEND Parent Forum. We are very grateful for the open and honest discussion, and for the trust you placed in sharing your experiences with us.

A key theme throughout the meeting was communication. Parents told us that communication needs to be clearer, more consistent, and easier to navigate. In response, we will be taking a number of steps, including promoting the SEND email address more clearly, introducing a dedicated SEND section in the parent newsletter, and ensuring that parents receive confirmation when emails or reports are received. We will also be sharing a clear SEND team structure so that families know who to contact. Alongside this, we are committed to improving the way we communicate so that it is more accessible, inclusive, and supportive for all families.

We also discussed support around diagnosis and the importance of parents knowing whether information has been received and acted upon. We will therefore be introducing clearer systems to confirm receipt of reports and diagnoses, improving our SEND administration processes, and setting clearer expectations for response times so that parents know when they can expect to hear back.

Another important area raised was the consistency of SEND support across the school. We recognise that provision is not always as consistent as it should be, and this is a priority for improvement. We will be strengthening staff training, ensuring all staff have a clear understanding of pupils' needs, and reinforcing the expectation that every teacher is responsible for SEND support.

More broadly, there was a strong focus on inclusion. We are fully committed to building a school where every child feels understood, valued, and supported. This includes continuing to develop more inclusive communication, improving staff understanding of a wide range of needs, and ensuring that our culture reflects and celebrates diversity.

We were not able to cover every item on the agenda during this session, but these will be picked up in future forums. We will continue to share updates with you as this work progresses.

Temporary Relaxation of School Uniform – Hot Weather

With the weather forecast for the coming week indicating high temperatures, we want to ensure that all children remain comfortable while in school.

As a result, we will be temporarily relaxing some uniform expectations for the forthcoming week.

During this period:

- **Ties, jumpers and blazers do not need to be worn.**
- Children should otherwise continue to wear their **normal school uniform** - [Uniform | Trevelyan Middle School Wood Close, Windsor, SL4 3LL](#)
- The **official Trevelyan PE kit may be worn on PE days only.**
- A reminder that all pupils should wear **appropriate uniform suitable for school**, particularly in warm weather (e.g. girls should avoid very short or unsuitable items such as hot pants).
- All children should bring a **water bottle** to school each day.
- Children are encouraged to bring and wear a **sun hat when outdoors.**
- **Sunscreen should be applied before school;** please do not send sunscreen into school with your child.
- **Shaded areas will be available** during break and lunchtime.
- We will **adapt or reduce strenuous activities**, including PE, if temperatures become too high.

These arrangements will be in place for the whole week and will be **reviewed each Friday** to determine whether they should continue for the following week.
