A message from Mr Strudley, Headteacher

Over the past two days, we have had the pleasure of welcoming our new Year 5 pupils as they begin their transition journey to Trevelyan. It was wonderful to meet them and see the enthusiasm, curiosity and excitement they already bring. While starting a new school can feel daunting, one message sat at the heart of our transition programme: you belong here.

Our Year 7 pupils played a huge part in making this happen. They were outstanding role models throughout the visit, demonstrating the kindness, responsibility and maturity that make us so proud. Their willingness to help, answer questions and reassure younger pupils showed our values in action and reminded us how much they have grown during their time at Trevelyan.

At the same time, our Year 8 pupils were visiting their new schools in preparation for September. We hope they enjoyed the opportunity to explore their next chapter and begin building confidence about the transition ahead. Like our incoming Year 5s, they are stepping into something new, and we know that brings a mixture of emotions.

In truth, transition is not just about Year 4 and Year 8. I suspect many pupils across the school are feeling a combination of excitement and nervousness as they think about September. Whether moving into Year 5, 6, 7 or 8, there will be new teachers, new expectations, fresh challenges and opportunities to grow. Those feelings are entirely normal and often a sign that something important and worthwhile is about to begin.

At Trevelyan, our ethos is to Inspire, Challenge and Grow, supported by the values of curiosity, resilience, innovation and social responsibility. These values help us navigate times of change. We encourage our pupils to be curious about new opportunities, resilient when things feel challenging, innovative in finding solutions, and socially responsible in supporting one another. Most importantly, we want every child to know that they are part of a community that cares for them and believes in them.

As our Year 8 pupils prepare to leave, we hope they do so with a deep sense of pride in all they have achieved. Although they may be moving on to new schools, they will always be part of the Trevelyan community. Equally, we hope our new Year 5 pupils leave their first schools with happy memories and treasured friendships, before arriving at Trevelyan with confidence, knowing that they have a place here.

Because whether pupils are joining us, moving through the school, or preparing to leave, the message remains the same: you belong, you matter, and you are part of Team Trevelyan.

Finally, and on a very different note, please be aware that school will be open as usual on Monday. We know that the England v Mexico match kicks off at 1.00am and that many of our students may choose to watch the game. Whether they do so is, of course, a matter for families.

We recognise that major sporting occasions create memories that last a lifetime, and we will balance our usual high expectations with a degree of understanding and common sense on Monday morning. We very much hope that everyone who watches the match enjoys the occasion and, of course, that England give us something to celebrate.

Temporary Relaxation of School Uniform – Hot Weather

With the weather forecast indicating ongoing high temperatures, we want to ensure that all children remain comfortable while in school.

As a result, we will be temporarily relaxing some uniform expectations until the end of term.

During this period:

- **Ties, jumpers and blazers do not need to be worn.**
- Children should otherwise continue to wear their **normal school uniform** - [Uniform | Trevelyan Middle School Wood Close, Windsor, SL4 3LL](#)
- The **official Trevelyan PE kit** may be worn on **PE days only**.
- A reminder that all pupils should wear **appropriate uniform suitable for school**, particularly in warm weather (e.g. girls should avoid very short or unsuitable items such as hot pants).
- All children should bring a **water bottle** to school each day.
- Children are encouraged to bring and wear a **sun hat when outdoors**.
- **Sunscreen should be applied before school**; please do not send sunscreen into school with your child.
- **Shaded areas will be available** during break and lunchtime.
- We will **adapt or reduce strenuous activities**, including PE, if temperatures become too high.
